




MR. MARKO GJOF GIEVSKI

We are actually very happy to be here for the first time at this incredible Youth Conference. Basically, common goals brought us together even before the conference. We might not have a solution for that but we have an offer and that's our aim.



MR. FALK SCHLEEICHER Deputy head of Goethe-Institut Skopje





If the current blockade of the whole accession process is not lifted two other things come to my mind that will be next, which would have a negative effect on further integration of the Western Balkans within the European Union. First, it is inevitable that there will be rising euro skepticism in the Western Balkans. And second, this creates a geo-strategical void. The EU insists that the Western Balkans is a geostrategic priority for the EU, but this thing offsets the complete idea so non-western, non-democratic actors are gaining further influence in the Western Balkans right now.To wrap up what we know so far is that the domestic political and administrative actors in the Western Balkans lack the capacity to pursue critical reforms without external incentives, without the backing from the European Union. So unless something is done, I don't think that we can be reserved optimists as we have been so far, but there is a huge chunk of pessimism coming in the near future if things are not fixed quickly.

> MR. IVAN AMJANOVSKI Associate professor at Faculty of Law, Ss. Cyril and Methodius University

It's really in the citizens best interest to have an active role in pushing the regional cooperation agenda forward. The regional cooperation needs to be Inclusive and I mean that regionally and socially. So we are talking about all six Western Balkan economies and we are talking about all social groups whose voices can be conveyed either through the parliamentary dialogue, through civil society dialogue or through engaging the underrepresented social groups in the decision-making processes.

MS. BILJANA GEORGI VSKA

Project Manager at UNDP North Macedonia and ReLOaD Project Officer



It's a complex situations because the Western Balkan markets are small. The best way in our opinion is to cooperate and bring joint forces. We cannot offer a solution for the many problems that we are facing, with many challenges in our countries, like for example the brain drain, the lack of opportunities, but we can offer a platform with different stakeholders. We can bring them together, they can make a program to support the young people in finding their vocational opportunities in their own countries. The aim is to support them from their initial education in their transition to the job market to the work.







We also need to work harder to create the awareness in the civil societies across the region that only if we combine pressure coming from the citizens and civil societies from the bottom up and the pressures coming from international organizations only in that way we can really maintain and create proper pressure on the domestic political elites to continue with these sometimes painful reforms in the accession process. When I say painful I think painful for the political elites, because essentially leaders who don't cheat are maybe kind of utopia, they're not born they're created and we need to uncreate them by maintaining, creating and boosting very active civil society. Civil society which is very well connected to citizens, which really communicates to young people and to the citizens overall.

MS. MILENA LAZA Executive Director at European Policy Centre/Centar za evropske politike – CEP



We have a problem in the Western Balkan and that is that there is an increasingly decreasing human capital in the Western Balkans. Young people are moving out. Young people feel are alienated from society, they are not the optimists in society and they frequently try to find way out and not participate in the state building. There are no state building events which hold people here, offer some space for enthusiasm and make them participate in societal processes. There is a necessity of this tipping point where we can basically stop people moving away, because I don't see how the numbers of development tell us that people in this state will stay because of economic development and education and business opportunities. They simply are not here. We are trying to create a possibility for political pressure in the lack of economic opportunities.

MR. ADNAN CERTIMAGIC Senior Analyst at European Stability Initiative (ESI) We need to talk about how we teach history and how we speak about history. We need to win the battle that the looking at the history in an open way where we are ready to be disappointed by some of our heroes is a right way. We also need to make sure that across the region young generations are brought up with thinking that military and weapons can never solve any of the economic, political or any other problems that we have, but they will make it even worse. We need to make sure that our governments support reconciliation and civil society organizations.

MS MIRELA RAJK VIC Executive Directress at SEEYN

It's good to have youth participation, It looks nice in our portfolio. But what is for me crucial is that it's not good to be in our portfolio. It's actually our responsibility. Because all governments actually are taking loans or make some political measures that are directly affecting the well- being of young people of nowadays. It's even more, because our governments are taking loans for the generations, which are still not born. Therefore in every moment, there should be a place for young people to protect the interests of young people in a decision making process. That's why I actually don't like this term youth policies, because for me each policy should be youth friendly, but also friendly for all generation.




In general, still youth councils are not capable enough or don't have still enough capacities to act and solve all issues that young people have nowadays. And I believe somehow it's not gonna happen for a long time or maybe never, but that's not the problem. I think that the bigger issue or challenge is that youth councils will have much bigger power once when young people realize that youth councils are their platforms, platforms that they can really influence on each need they have or each change they want to see in the society.

"The digitalization is going to happen. In our countries too, sooner or later. Is going to happen sooner If we press as a citizens our political authorities. It is a political decision, but a political decision is going to become reality If we as a citizens press the need. If we do not erase the problem, the problem is going to stay here. So the thing is that you as a youth you must press for solution, you must speak, you must raise the voice. System is not going to be changed If the citizens do not press for changes."





MR. MARKO KRT LICA Assistant Professor at Faculty of law "Iustinianus Primus

I would like to finish with one point that I believe is most important for all of us, but foryou the young people specifically and that is the notion of integrity. I understand that in the societies where we live It's very difficult foryoung people to see and understand the value of integrity, of having values and always really straining ourselves to do the right thing, to think ethically and to always keep our integrity whenever we are faced with a decision, whether it's a life decision or a business decision. In my personal experience but also in the experience of the young people that I have around me, having integrity and leading your lives with integrity is something that long term will add the biggest value foryou in in your lives and in your professional futures.".

I believe that if we want to understand where jobs are going, what youth need, what kind of things will happen in the future we should look at what these generations look for, because they will save the future. We need to teach young people to love life learning and adaptability. Because everything is changing all the time. So we should learn how to learn. How to level up ourselves and how to go to the next step. Because we cannot build the future for youth be we can build the youth for the future."

MR. JOHN HARI—IAS Founder and President of Infinity Greece



It is your time now so this is a moment for the youth to be fully involved. The role of institutions has to be to make sure that you are involved in the policies that are drafted for youth. And your role on the other hand is to stand up and talk out loud and make sure that you are heard. Because you know better what is necessary for you to adapt to a changing world. And the only way to do this is through your involvement. And I think that is what we need from youth. A youth that is active. A youth that is participating, because Institutions are only as strong as the people that they represent."

The most shortest answer to your question: "How much does the future cost?" I would answer that cost or the sum of it comes down to our input in creating that future. Me as representative of a regional institution I have to start with the suggestion that we see the regional cooperation as most important priority in achieving the region's future. METODIJA STJCESKI President of Youth Alliance t Young people should not pay the cost of staying in their home countries. That is paid by the older generation. We paid enough not only in material things. We lost time. I can say that one generation is completely lost. But now we can learn from the past and you as a young generation must learn these lessons. You should cooperate, you should connect between each other."







We are at the youth conference so let's start by saying that we the youth are at a very large extent disappointed by previous generations. We were handed over a planet going through climate change, which quickly evolved into a climate crisis and our share to that is very small. But the truth is that even if it sounds a bit too fatalistic there is no planet B indeed. The relationship with the environment needs to be restored and this of course is in our hands with nature's help."

19TH INTERNATIONAL YOUTH CONFERENCE

September 30 - October 4, 2021

Krusevo - North Macedonia

The International Youth Conference "European Values for the Future of the SEE Countries "was initiated in 2003 to grow into a Traditional Youth Conference actively attended by more than 1000 different individuals, youth leaders for the last 19 years. Back in the day, European values in the SEE countries were a significant issue affecting everyone. Now, 19 years after the first conference, the topic is still vigorous and pending, but the political – economic map of the region has notably changed. Although all countries embarked from the same point, the situation today is different in each of them.

This year's conference took place under the general topic "Regional Transformation" and aimed to provide answers from youth to some of the most pressing questions in the region, focusing on European integration, in times of unprecedented challenges.

During the 19th International Youth Conference, six panel sessions with 25 panelists were held, covering the following topics:





Additionally, since we strongly believe that the involvement of those who are the subjects of the policies to be developed is essential, the young participants of the conference were given the chance to participate in working groups in order to develop their visions for the region, propose policies and measures, as well as youth actions which will contribute to the realization of the created visions.

In total, the 60 participants of the conference were divided in 3 working groups and, with the assistance of 3 facilitators and 3 reporters, came up with the following vision, recommendations for implementing that vision, and pledges for actions they commit to taking in order to ensure their vision is carried through, in the following 5 topics:



In this document we are sharing with you the conclusions and recommendations created by the young participants of the conference, towards a positive regional transformation.



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INCLUSICON, COOPERATION AND PARTNERSHIP

OUR VISI N

The introduction of effectively implemented mechanisms for achieving regional youth cooperation that act as a "catalyst" towards regional transformation.

OUR POLICY RECOMMEN DATIONS

Based on our collaborative process of developing policy recommendations during IYC, we propose:

- The implementation of joint public-private investments towards establishing railroad routes that unite all SEE capitals;
- Redirecting investments in tourism towards promoting regional mobility within SEE countries;
- Investing on the collaborative creation of TV shows, documentaries and feature films on the common history and culture of the Balkans, as well as on the promotion of existing related projects;
- The establishment of regional cooperation offices throughout the SEE countries in order to promote cooperation among youth;
- The establishment of a regional council with representatives of all SEE countries, in charge
 of a collaborative revision of history books;
- The regulation of all diplomas in the region from universities; so they can work and use diplomas in every country of the region;
- The strengthening of the transparent authorities against fake news and sanction fake news creators.
- Investing in initiatives that will directly combat nationalism by focusing on multicultural cooperation in the SEE region, such as the aforementioned examples.

- We plan to implement multicultural activities in schools for presenting different cultural backgrounds through art, theater, food and music;
- We aim to promote our policy recommendations through personal and organizational social media channels, especially among youth;
- We will organise soft skills development youth-led workshops in cooperation between different SEE counties to foster relevant partnerships;
- We will organise events involving youth from universities in SEE countries in order to promote study programs and exchange programs among them;
- We will plan informative seminars providing guidance on how to get involved in youth councils, CSOs and institutions in various SEE countries.



SECUFRIY, RULE OF LAW AND CORRUPTION

OUR VISI N

A SEE region based on rule of law, with a fair and functional legal system, zero tolerance towards corruption and a high level of transparency.

OUR POLICY RECOMMEN ATIONS

Based on our collaborative process of developing policy recommendations during IYC, we propose:

- The establishment of an independent committee on Law Enforcement and Corruption in all SEE countries, with members from all SEE countries not affiliated to any entities that may pose conflicts of interest in their position, mandated to assess the state of play in the region and release publicly accessible reports, including recommendations for relevant next steps to national and local governments;
- The creation of a Regional Convention, controlled by a body of experts that has non-partisan representatives and a youth majority;
- Increasing penalties for corruption and legally prohibiting convicted government officials from taking over the same or similar positions in the future;
- The establishment of effective methods and tools to measure the quantitative and qualitative impact of the implementation of anti-corruption laws, frequently releasing related publicly accessible reports.

- We will encourage youth in our countries to be part of the decision-making process by offering seminars on understanding politics and policies, and encourage active citizens participation in youth organisations, with the help of academia;
- We will strive for the implementation of activities on critical thinking in Social Media;
- We will become more heavily involved in Local Youth Councils, carrying our innovative ideas born in initiatives such as youth conferences or international workshops forward.

YOUTH PARTICIPATION IN DECISION MAKIN

OUR VISICON

Young people should be represented in a society as decision-makers with equal say and have more opportunities for personal development and growth on local as well as national level.

OUR POLICY RECOMMEN DATIONS

Based on our collaborative process of developing policy recommendations during IYC, we propose:

- The implementation of reforms in public education in the region, to include but not be limited to:
- O Civic education in all school levels;
- O More representative bodies for youth (Youth Councils, Junior Parliaments etc);
- O Emphasizing and recognising the importance of non-formal and informal learning as an integral part of education;
- The creation of a cross-regional platform for private businesses and public institutions to advertise internships and traineeships, and ensure awareness of all related opportunities within schools;
- The introduction of more opportunities for youth participation in the decision-making processes on both local and national level, inspired by examples such as Participatory Budgeting, EU Youth Dialogue etc, developed in collaboration with youth.

- We will create a social media page to raise awareness on the importance of voting and being active in youth organizations;
- We commit to promoting the establishment of Junior Parliaments aiming to develop and propose policy recommendations to the State Parliaments of SEE countries;
- We will build an online forum to provide a larger space for youth to develop and engage with their own ideas and demands around social and political issues;
- We will take actions to preserve the existing debate clubs in universities and youth hubs by helping them gain publicity on a national and bilateral level;
- We will run online campaigns for and with young people actively involved in politics.

SUSTAINAEBILITY AND A GREENER REGIODI

OUR VISI N

We envision a region with a sustainable culture, driven by green policies and innovative technologies, with strong regulations.

OUR POLICY RECOMMEN CONS

Based on our collaborative process of developing policy recommendations during IYC, we propose:

- Introducing a mandatory subject on environmental sustainability in the public education curriculum, common for all SEE countries;
- Implementing a working infrastructure for recycling in schools, including a public awareness campaign for its correct usage;
- The implementation of various methods and effective legislation for averting corporate pollution (such as carbon tax);
- Increasing funding for public transport, focusing on vehicles that rely on renewable energy sources (electric trams, natural gas city buses etc);
- Ensuring proper infrastructure as to the means of transportation in the city enabling access to all citizens;
- Introducing grants and other financing mechanisms for various green initiatives, utilising relevant EU and national and cross-regional funds;
- Improving awareness and preparatory structures for combating natural disasters, based on already successful models of risk management;

- We will organise environmental cleaning activities in schools on a monthly basis, so as to actively engage younger children in environmentally friendly actions, building a green culture for the next generation;
- We will promote meaningful green initiatives in our university sustainability clubs;
- We will lobby for regional green policies through dedicated international youth synergies built around this purpose;
- We will build a website designed to promote green energy, green policies and rasing awareness on environmental issues through articles, photos, videos and fun facts.

DIGITALISATION AND INNOVATION

OUR VISICON

We envision adequate knowledge transfer and access to ICT (Information Communication Technology) for people of all ages, including (but not limited to) young people & public institutions. Public services and educational tools should be offered to all SEE citizens to use well organised and visualised data from the use of ICT tools and services in the region to develop an easier and more efficient lifestyle.

OUR POLICY RECOMMEN DATIONS

Based on our collaborative process of developing policy recommendations during IYC, we propose:

- The introduction of a continuous consultation process between the Ministries of Education of SEE countries and the students of primary schools, high-schools and universities in the region, aiming to identify the level of information, engagement and encouragement received through public education on the topics of innovation and entrepreneurship, and the subsequent adaptation and improvement of the curriculum according to the feedback of the students;
- The establishment of an awareness campaign on the benefits of digitising public services and visualising citizen data on the usage of such services;
- The improvement of digitising public services in the region, allowing easy access to public services to all citizens through an "e-Municipality" project;
- The establishment of a regional fund for youth-led innovative businesses in the SEE countries, aiming to encourage and promote entrepreneurship amongst youth;
- The introduction of tax deductions and related benefits for the founding of new ICT companies by SEE youth, and the acquiring of ICT equipment by youth-led companies;
- The introduction of a cross-regional project for IT companies to donate equipment in schools and civil society throughout the SEE countries;
- The introduction of a digital nomad visa program for SEE citizens, encouraging cross-regional mobility and inspiration from related best practices;
- The introduction of educational activities on the basic usage of ICT technologies in nursing homes and for the elderly, throughout the region.

OUR YOUTH PLEEDGES

- We will host presentations on the benefits of digitising public services and reflect on the existing procedures in our local communities;
- We will initiate a collaborative process with youth parliament members and ministers of youth in order to create a legal framework for digital nomad visas;
- We will establish liaison offices with countries that have already implemented well developed e-government services in order to get guidance and inspiration for our countries in their attempt of doing the same;
- We will include rural areas in our attempt to promote ICT literacy by developing and implementing workshops on basic ICT knowledge in primary schools and local libraries.



The consummation of this year's International Youth Conference in Krusevo shapes a promising network of young professionals, ready to take action and inspire ideas for a more sustainable and inclusive future in the SEE region. After careful consideration and intense brainstorming, we managed to come together and build our own vision plan, having in mind the very concrete obstacles on our way of its implementation. It is our sincere hope that our mobilisation will be the first step of including youth in the decision making process, as well as the beginning of a firm regional cooperation, shaping both the present and the future of the European Union.







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
